

City Ordinance 13-30 (1) Snow Emergency. A snow emergency may be declared when two or more inches of snow are forecast. However, additional factors such as ice, wind and/or rain can also dictate the declaration of a snow emergency. During a snow emergency, on-street parking is not allowed. No vehicle shall be parked in or on any part of a public street or right-of-way of a public street during snow removal operations. Drivers are encouraged to find alternate parking spots before the first snow event. Violators will be ticketed first, and towed if not moved within 24 hours from the time of the ticket. If a resident has a driveway or garage apron on which to park, it is strongly suggested that these areas be used.

City Ordinance 50-4 REMOVAL OF SNOW, ICE AND ACCUMULATIONS. It shall be the responsibility of the abutting property owners to remove snow, ice and accumulations promptly from sidewalks. If a property owner does not remove snow, ice or accumulations within 48 hours from the end of the snow or ice event, the City may do so and assess the costs against the property owner for collection in the same manner as a property tax. Property owners will be billed \$25 per hour plus a \$50 administration fee. 364.12 State Code
