Snow Emergency

A snow emergency may be declared when two or more inches of snow are forecast. However, additional factors such as ice, wind and/or rain can also dictate the declaration of a snow emergency. Notifications of snow emergencies shall be made by the City through local TV news channels, City Facebook page, City website, and Alert Iowa. During a snow emergency, no vehicle shall be parked in or on any part of a public street or right-of-way of a public street during snow removal operations. Drivers are encouraged to find alternate parking spots before the first snow event. Please make every attempt to park off the paved section of streets. Please remove snow & ice from sidewalks within 48 hours of a snow event.

**Please remember you will only be notified of snow and other emergencies if you signed up at Alert Iowa or Cedar County Emergency Management.

Phone Numbers

If you have had a change in your phone number, please let City Hall know so we may update your account. Many of our residents no longer have a land line and have strictly gone to using their cell phone. It is important that we have a working phone number on your account to keep you informed about water main breaks, high water bills due to leaks, and other water issues. Thank you!

Go Green Earn A \$5 Credit By Signing Up For E-Bills

Due to rising postage fees, the City of Durant and Durant Municipal Electric are offering a one-time \$5 credit on your utility bill to anyone signing up for emailed bills.

Utility billing E-bills (emailed bills) offer you these exciting advantages:

- Go paperless (Go Green!)
- Eliminate the risk of your bill being lost or damaged in the mail
- Receive your utility bills earlier than via traditional mail
- Increase the level of privacy compared to postcard bills delivered via traditional mail

Sign up today by stopping at City Hall and Durant Municipal Electric to fill out the E-bills application. You must stop at both locations to sign up, as each entity has its own form.

Automatic Bank Payments (Ach)

The City of Durant offers payment of your utility bill through automatic bank payments. We require the customer to fill out an "Authorization for Direct Payments" form (found on our website www.cityofdurantiowa.com or available at City Hall) and return it to City Hall by the 5th of the month that you authorize the city to start the automatic withdrawal. This can be set up for any bank or credit union. A statement bill will still be mailed or emailed to the customer and automatic payment will occur on the 20th of the month or if the 20th falls on a weekend or holiday, the first banking business day following the 20th.


Utility Reminders

Call Before you Dig

Prior to starting an outdoor digging project call Iowa One Call at 811 or 1-800-292-8989 (it's the law). Iowa One Call is a free service that will notify utilities to come mark the location of underground lines. You must call 48 hours in advance of digging (not counting weekends or holidays).

Durant Volunteer Ambulance Service

Yahoo, it's a new year! Sure hope you welcomed 2025 in without having a doozy of a headache the next day. The end of the old year and the beginning of the new year allows us to reflect on the past year and make resolutions that we hope to accomplish in the new year even though we know very well in the back of our minds we will probably not be successful.

Let's see what the ambulance service can reflect on this past year. Some of the highs and lows are listed per month.

January - We held our annual holiday party to celebrate the new year. Unfortunately, we had 2 of our volunteer drivers leave the service.

February - Orville Randolph, a long time emergency medical responder, resigned. We participated in the Durant Career Fair.

March - There was a change in the way emergency services would be dispatched. The closest ambulance service would respond rather than the ambulance that served that territory.

April - We participated in operation prom to show the school students that bad choices may lead to bad consequences. Another of our volunteer drivers left the service.

May - We were introduced to the 'Iowa First Aid Project' which was being piloted by several counties in the state. This project would allow selected individuals in the county to respond to certain emergencies without being state certified. Another volunteer driver left the service.

June - We participated in the emergency vehicle showcase where people could go through the ambulance to see what equipment we carried and to talk to some of our personnel. We added a volunteer driver to our roster.

July - We participated in the Walcott Days parade. We were unable to participate in the BIX 7 race due to being short staffed.

August - This is parade month and we participated in the Durant Firemen's parade and the Wilton Founder's Day parade. Although we were invited to other parades we could not attend due to our short staff.

September - We celebrated our 50th anniversary by having an Open House. The nemesis of ambulance service personnel, back injuries, struck 2 of our crew members. Both will be unable to respond to calls for several months with one having to resign from the service. Another crew person will be out for 2 - 3 months due to an injury.

October - Daytime staffing became more difficult with the temporary loss of the crew members last month. Ideas are being considered to shore up the ranks. **November** - Several members attended the Iowa Emergency Medical Services Association conference in Des Moines to get continuing education hours for their recertification. Six members of the community completed driver and/or member applications.

December - The individuals accepted to be drivers/ members are completing our orientation process and will be beginning their probationary time.

The other side of the coin is the making of resolutions. These are a few of ours for the new year:

- 1) We shall believe the I-80 driver who called 911 at 2:00 A. M. and claims someone is injured as he saw them drive into the ditch even though he did not stop to help them nor did he see them drive out of the ditch and continue their journey on I-80.
- 2) We shall believe the patient who was found lying along I-80 after not receiving a ride for more than an hour while hiking across Iowa in 10 degree Fahrenheit weather who is cold, tired, and hungry but states he has chest pain radiating to his left shoulder and arm, neck, and jaw. Almost forgot, he states he has pain in both legs.
- 3) We shall believe the patient who has been unresponsive due to a street medication he consumed and is now coherent and says, I'll be good". I still have a rib that occasionally reminds me that he may not have been telling the truth.
- 4) We shall believe the patient who has his arms handcuffed behind his back because he just finished fighting with law enforcement and states, "If you remove the handcuffs I will behave on the way to the hospital."
- 5) We shall believe the patient who has difficulty walking, slurred speech, bloodshot eyes, and parked his car on its side in the ditch when he tells us, "I only had 2 beers."
- 6) We will continue with our best effort to respond to all calls we receive.
- 7) We will continue the best quality comfort and care we can provide to the individuals living, visiting, or passing through our community and the surrounding area we serve.

You may be able to tell we are having issues with staffing and as the saying goes, "things always get worse before they get better". We lost some very good people from our service this past year but recently have added some enthusiastic community people to fill those voids. Museum Moments

In 1920, Dr. Thomas Jacobs, M.D. bought a property located at present day 500 Block of 5th Street. He opened an office and enlarged the building so it could serve as a hospital. The hospital's operating room, located on the north side of the building featured a huge window. The window was a source of extra light. The hospital remained open until 1933, with Ella Claussen R.N., as Superintendent.

In 1936, J.S. Bradford opened a rooming house in this building. Nellie Ehlert operated the building as a tourist home in 1938. Wm Lohse purchased the building in 1944 and remodeled it into an apartment building.

Elmer Langmann purchased the property in 1946, Emil Bannister in 1950 and C. Wayne and Velma Garvin in 1959. Other owners include George Frick and Durant Children's Group. Casey's General Store razed the building and an adjacent property to build their current business location.
