Water/Sewer/Storm Water Rate Increases

Water and sewer rates will be increasing by 2% and will be reflected on the July 1, 2025 bill. The water minimum charge shall be \$20.89 plus tax per household or business per billing month. The water minimum consumption per customer shall be 1000 gallons. All water usage above 1000 gallons shall be charged .00358/gallon. The sewer minimum charge shall be \$50.79 per household or business (plus tax) per billing month. The sewer minimum per customer shall be 1000 gallons. All sewer usage above 1000 gallons shall be charged .009329/gallon. The storm water charge will go from \$1.00 per month to \$1.50 per month.

Tornado Sirens

Our public works staff will be testing the tornado sirens monthly April through October, the first Tuesday of each month at 10:00 a.m. for three minutes.

Burning Schedule

Yard waste burning ended as of May 31st. It will resume September 1st.



Yard Waste Site

The yard waste site (100 8 th Avenue) is open Monday-Sunday 8:00 am-7:00 pm. This site only accepts yard waste. If it doesn't grow in your yard, please do not deposit it here. Please remember to put your tree brush outside the yard waste site in the area left of the driveway as you are headed to the sewer plant.

Yard Waste and Brush Disposal

Service is provided through Oveson Refuse & Recycle from April 1st through November 30th for grass, leaves, and garden debris only. Yard waste must be placed in a paper yard waste bag (these can be purchased at a grocery, hardware, or discount store) with a yard waste sticker that can be purchased at City Hall for \$1.00 each. Yard waste should be put out on Tuesday with your regular garbage.

Utility Reminders

Shutoff notices for delinquent May bills will be distributed on the morning of Monday, June 9th, with payment due by noon on Tuesday, June 10th. Remember a \$25 fee is applied to your account if you receive a shutoff notice.

Building Permits

Please call building inspector, Terry Goerdt, at 319.330.9806, or email goerdtservices@outlook.com, for all questions on permits. Permits are required for all new construction, building alterations, accessory & storage shed buildings, and concrete work. Permits are also required for signs, fences, and swimming pools over 5000 gallons. Per state regulations building permits are required for electrical work, plumbing, and heating/AC projects. Permits are not required for roofing, siding, & windows. Building permit applications are available at City Hall and on our website www.cityofdurantiowa. com. We ask that you please allow 48 at least hours for your permit to be approved before starting your project.



Automatic Bank Payments (ACH)

The City of Durant offers payment of your utility bills through automatic bank payments. We require the customer to fill out an "Authorization for Direct Payments" form (found on our website www. cityofdurantiowa.com or available at City Hall) and return it to City Hall by the 5th of the month that you authorize the city to start the automatic withdrawal. This can be set up for any bank or credit union. A statement bill will still be mailed or emailed to the customer and automatic payment will occur on the 20th of the month or if the 20th falls on a weekend or holiday, the first banking business day following the 20th.

Go Green & Earn a \$5 Credit by Signing up for E-Bills

Due to rising postage fees, the City of Durant and Durant Municipal Electric are offering a one-time \$5 credit on your utility bill to anyone signing up for emailed bills.

Utility billing E-bills (emailed bills) offer you these exciting advantages:

- Go paperless (Go Green!)
- Eliminate the risk of your bill being lost or damaged in the mail
- Receive your utility bills earlier than via traditional mail
- Increase the level of privacy compared to postcard bills delivered via traditional mail

Sign up today by stopping at City Hall and Durant Municipal Electric to fill out the E-bills application. You must stop at both locations to sign up, as each entity has its own form.

Durant Ambulance

For the past few months, the ambulance articles have been about becoming a driver, first responder, emergency medical technician (EMT), or a paramedic.

They also explained some of the skills they learned and may use when treating patients. This article will be different as it will tell some of the happenings taking place with the Durant Volunteer Ambulance Service (DVAS).

We have had 6 community members become drivers recently giving us a total of 11. Unfortunately, we will be losing 2 medical personnel within the next 3-4 months. Fortunately, one of our drivers is on the brink of becoming an EMT which will bring our total medical personnel to 8.

The new ambulance ordered in 2023 with delivery in March, 2025, has been delayed with delivery now scheduled for June, 2025. It may also be a little more expensive.

The call volume for the DVAS has decreased from approximately 700+ to less than 1 per day for the first 5 months of 2025. From January to May 19th, 2025, we were dispatched 136 times. The major effect this will have will be financial.

On a brighter note, June 14 is Flag Day. Remember to display "Old Glory" with pride and the next day is Father's Day. Be sure to make his day special by calling him or take him out for a meal.
